Chippewa	4	4-5'	3-8 lbs	July	Sweet berry flavor. Medium sized fruit. Red fall color.
Northblue	4	4'	1-4 qts	Late July	Wild blueberry flavor. Upright in growth habit. Self-pollinating yields better when planted with another variety. Ht. 18-24"
Northcountry	4	4'	1-4 qts	Late July	Height 18-24". Flavor sweet to mild. Most outstanding plant for landscapes. Turns fiery red in fall. By U of MN.
Northland	4	3-4'	5-10 lbs.	July	Small dark blue fruit with wild berry flavor. Makes an attractive landscape plant. Beautiful foliage all growing season.
Northsky	4	12-18"	1-3 lbs.	July	Medium size sky blue fruit. Good red fall color.
Patriot	4	4-6'	10-20 lbs	Late July	Height 4-6 ft. Fruit size is large, firm. Ornamental use good. Developed by university of Maine.
Polaris	3	3-4'		July	Self-fruitful, aromatic, firm berry, excellent flavor. Excellent for fresh eating, baking and jelly
St. Cloud	3	3-4'	7 lbs.	July	Self-fruitful, upright habit, excellent for fresh eating, baking and jelly
Superior	3	3-5'		July	Self fruitful, sweet firm fruit. Excellent for fresh eating, baking, sauce, pies
CURRANT					
Consort Black	4	4-6'		July-August	Strong flavor black fruit. Very productive. Can be grown in part shade.
Red Lake	3	3-6'		July-August	Bears fruit on 2-3 yr. old wood. Semi-erect. Very productive. Good for jams and jellies.
GOOSEBERRY					
Pixwell	3	3-5'		July-August	Large bright red fruit on 2-3 yr. old wood. Very productive. Good for jams and jellies.
GRAPES					
Bluebell	3	7'	10-15 lbs	Mid Sept.	Blue black table fruit. Tender skin. Good for juice and jelly.
Concord	5	6'	10-15 lbs	Late Sept.	Good for fresh eating, jams and jellies.
Edelweiss	4	6'	10-12 lbs.	September	Sweet, good for fresh eating, wine making, baking.
Frontenac	4	6'	10-12 lbs	Mid Sept.	Red wine grape. Vigorous grower.
Marquette	4	6'	10 lbs	Mid Sept.	Red wine variety. Aromas of cherry, black pepper and spice.
Valiant	3	6'	10-15 lbs	Late Aug.	Large blue grape. Very cold hardy. Great for fresh eating.
HONEYBERRY					
Berry Blue	3	3'		Early Summer	Pollinator required. Hardy and drought tolerant. Use as pollinator for Borealis, Tundra and Indigo Gem.

Borealis	3	4-5'	10 lbs	Early Summer	Needs pollinator. Use for eating & baking
Cinderella	2	3'		Late May	Tastes similar to wild blueberry/black currant. Go-to for fresh eating. Excellent for jams and jellies.
Tundra	3	4-5'	10 lbs.	Early summer	Needs pollinator. Excellent for fresh eating, baking, sauce and pies.
RASPBERRY					
Boyne	3	2-3'	1 qt	Early July	Red. Medium acid, aromatic flavor. Excellent for canning, freezing, and dessert. Very hardy.
Bristol Black	4	4'	1 qt	Mid July	Fruit is black, large, and has firm flesh. Excellent quality, good flavor. Good for canning and freezing.
Bushel & Berry Raspberry ShortCake	3	2-3'	1 qt	Mid July	Thornless raspberry. Compact and rounded growth habit. Requires no staking and takes little room to grow.
Canby Red	4	5'-6'		Mid July	Best when planted with support. Excellent for freezing, canning, cooking, & fresh eating.
Caroline	4	3-4'		Late June & Early Sept.	Self Fruiting. Good eating, pies, and baking.
Fallgold	3	3-4'		Late Summer/ Early Fall	Self-fertile. Excellent fresh eating, preserves, and pies. Yellow berry brings excitement to garden.
Heritage	4	2-3'	1 qt	July-Sept.	Red. Everbearing fruit with firm flesh and medium size. Mid July and Sept.
Indian Summer	4	5-6'		Late June & Early Sept.	Ever-bearing. Excellent for jams, jellies, pies, and tarts. Tolerant of heavy soils.
Latham	4	3-4'	1-2 qts.	Late June/EA July	Self Fruitful. Excellent red berry good for eating and baking
Souris	3	3-4'	1-2 qts.	July	Self fruitful. Excellent eating, baking and sauce

Canada Red	3			May	Bright red stems. Delicious for sauces and pies.
APARAGUS					
Jersey Knight	3	2-3'		May to Early June	Improvement over 'Mary Washington,' higher percent of male plants which produce larger spears
